



The following sections are from the Israeli Penal Law, 1977.

Laws and regulations which can be used to:

- **Prohibit or prevent the organization and advertising of sex tours and trips**

Section 205C (added in 1998): The section forbids advertisement of sexual services in general, unless the advertisement follows specific conditions. The punishment for this offence is 6 months imprisonment.

- **Prohibit or prevent the organization and advertising of sex tours and trips, especially those affecting children**

Section 205a (added in 1998): The section forbids advertisements of sexual services, given by minors (under 18), whether given inside or outside of Israel. The punishment - 5 years imprisonment.

Section 205b (added in 1998): The section forbids advertising that a minor gives sexual services, when in fact the service provider is not a minor. The punishment - 6 months imprisonment.

Extra-territoriality laws and regulations allowing to prosecute in your country its nationals for child sex offences committed abroad

More general laws applicable also to other types of crime

Section 15 allows the prosecution of Israeli citizens/inhabitants for offenses committed outside of Israel, but only when:

- (1) The behavior is also an offense under the other state's law.
- (2) No restriction on criminal liability applies to the offense under the laws of that state.
- (3) The person was not already found innocent of the offense, or if he was found guilty - he did not serve the penalty imposed on him.

Specific laws applicable to sexual abuse of children

Section 15(b): The restriction said in paragraph (1) above shall not apply if the offense is that of sexual abuse of children.

**Penalties relating to sex offences and crime against children in the country
For the sex exploiter (customer)**

Section 203C: If a person receives sex services from a minor, he is liable to three years imprisonment

**Penalties relating to sex offences and crime against children in the country
For the manager, controller, pimp or owner of a prostitution place**

Section 199 & 203B:

Pimping a minor aged between 14-18 - 7 years imprisonment

Pimping a minor under the age of 14 - 10 years imprisonment

Section 204:

Holding/managing a prostitution place - 5 years imprisonment

**Penalties relating to sex offences and crime against children in the country
For the procurer or trafficker who procures, seduces or traffics another person for prostitution**

Section 201-2 & 203b:

Bringing a minor aged between 14-18 to become a prostitute - 7 to 10 years imprisonment

Bringing a minor under age 14 to become a prostitute - 10 to 14 years imprisonment

Trafficking a minor for prostitution - 20 years imprisonment

**Penalties relating to sex offences and crime against children in the country
For the offender who detains or confines another person for prostitution**

Sections 201, 202, 203, 203b:

Bringing a minor to become a prostitute by using force or threats, or by using a situation not abling the minor to resist - 20 years imprisonment

Section 377:

False detainment of a person (general) - 3 years imprisonment
